



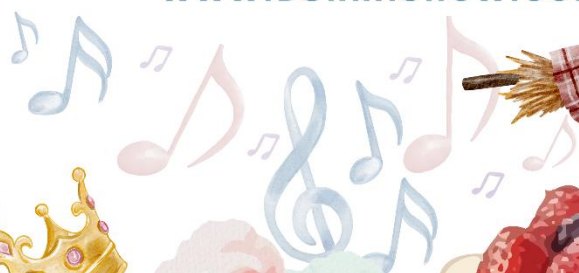

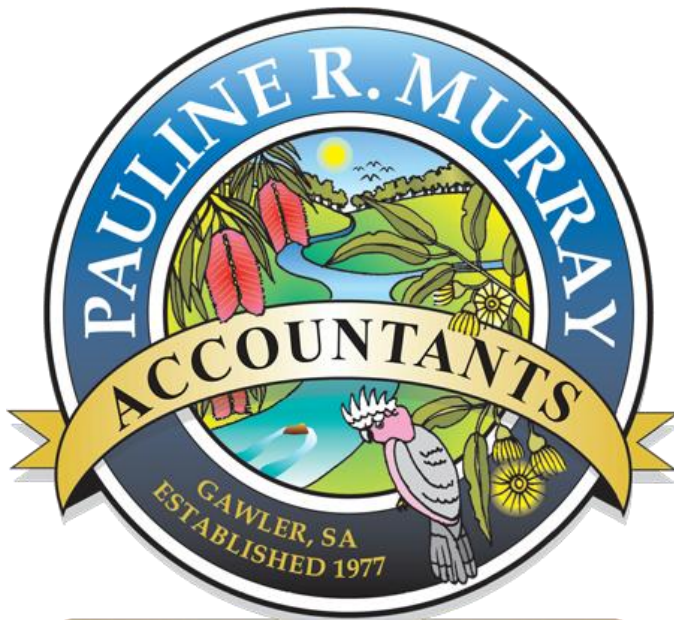

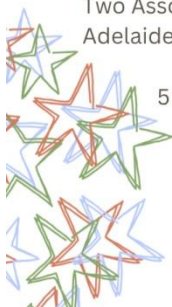

HINTS ON COOKING FOR JUDGING

- Definitely no cake cooler marks on any cakes.
- No testing marks in centre.
- Biscuits must be evenly baked top and bottom.
- Pizza to have nice even coloured bottom.
- Scones to be evenly coloured, not to be leaned over, no floury bottoms.
- Take special note of instructions in the show book.
- Loaf pan is approximately 21cm (L) x 11cm (W) x 5cm (D).
- Entries to be placed on own white plate or covered board.
- Take note of tin size and shape.

RECIPE - from RSL Queensland

1 cup plain flower	125g butter
1 cup rolled oats	1 tbsp golden syrup
1 cup desiccated coconut	1 tbsp hot water
1 cup brown sugar	1 tsp bicarb soda

Method: Preheat oven to 175 degrees Celsius. Combine flour, oats, coconut and sugar in a large bowl. In a saucepan, melt the butter and then add the golden syrup - it should froth up. Pour onto the dry ingredients and mix well. Taking spoonfuls of the mixture, roll them into balls and put them on a baking tray lined with baking paper, about 5cm apart. Use a fork to flatten them and then put them in the oven for 15 minutes or until they are golden brown. Let them cool on the baking tray for about a minute, and then move them to a wire rack to cool.

Bring to boil and simmer for 2 to 3 minutes.

Remove from heat, add 1 tsp bicarb soda, and then stir in 2 well beaten eggs, 1 cup flour.

Bake in round tin approx. 20cm.

Topping

100g butter ½ tsp nutmeg

1 cup sugar 1 cup plain flour

Method - Preheat oven to 190C. Cream butter & sugar. Add the egg.

Sift the flour & nutmeg & add to the mixture with essence & sultanas.

Lastly add the flat beer. Pour into a 23cm square tin.

Topping - Rub ingredients together until they make a crumbly mixture.

Sprinkle over the batter. Bake for approximately 40mins.

Scones are to be made using the Laucke's Country Women's Scone Mix.

Five (5) Sweet scones to be presented for judging.

The scones should be approximately 5cms in diameter, well risen, straight sides, no flour on the base, thin golden crust top and bottom. They should be fine, moist texture, good crumb, good flavour and according to type.

Entrants please note: you do not have to follow the recipe on the back of the box. You use the mix as a base only.

General Outline

Entrants are eligible to win one local final.

Winners of local shows are eligible to enter the semi final at the appropriate Association Show. The semi final MUST be separate to the host show local competition.

Semi Final winners are eligible to enter the State Final to be held at the 2026 Royal Adelaide Show.

RICH FRUIT CAKE RECIPE

(Cake is not to be iced)

Ingredients:

(Use Sunbeam Food products where possible)

250g butter	60g chopped red glace cherries
250g dark brown sugar	60g mixed peel
6 eggs	60g chopped almonds
250g sultanas	375g plain flour
250g raisins	1 tsp baking powder
200g currants	1 tsp mixed spice
100g dates	200ml sherry or brandy

Method:

Chop fruits, mix together and soak in the sherry or brandy overnight. Sift together flour, baking powder and spice. Cream together butter and sugar. Add eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add fruit and flour and lastly the chopped nuts. Mix thoroughly. Place mixture in a well prepared 19-22cm square tin, and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 to 3½ hours.

Note: Fruit should be cut to the size of currants.

HINTS FOR ABOVE COMPETITIONS:

1. Cakes should be cooked evenly all over – top, bottom and sides should be of even colour. Points to be deducted for uneven cooking.
2. Cakes must be well cooked right through – no damp or soggy patches.
3. Fruit should be evenly distributed throughout cake.
4. Fruit should be moist and clean.
5. Cake should be of a good even shape.
6. Points to be deducted for – cake rack marks, burnt edges, pieces of paper or foil which were not removed properly from cake, marks on cake from careless removal of paper.
7. All cakes will be cut by the judge.
8. Points to be allocated as follows:

Appearance	20 points
Cooking	10 points
Texture	10 points
Flavour	10 points

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REGULATIONS

1. In classes where prizes are awarded for highest number of points, will be allotted as follows, 1st 5 points 2nd 3 points 3rd 1 point. In the event of a tie the exhibitor taking the most 1st prizes shall be the winner.
2. Prices for admission to the grounds are as follows: Members free, on presentation of Member ticket, Adult non member \$10, Pensioner with card \$5.00, Children 5 yrs to 15 yrs \$5.00, Preschool free.
3. The President or Officer appointed by the society may withdraw any exhibit from being judged without any reason being given.
4. As soon as the judges' decision is given, the name of the exhibitor may be placed on the exhibit, and if same is for sale a price may be fixed therefore, or the time specified when it will be sold.
5. No person or persons will be admitted to the pavilion, yards, tents, show ring, enclosure or roped off space while articles or stock are being judged, except one person in charge of horses, committee and judges, the latter two whom will wear distinct identification.
6. No exhibitor or attendant with an exhibit giving annoyance to the judge, or making use of insulting language to the committee, judge, or officials shall be liable to have his or her exhibit disqualified and/or be expelled from the grounds.
7. No exhibitor or his agent shall have any personal communications with the judge while in the execution of their duties, on it being proved that such communications has been held the exhibitor may be disqualified. Should any information be required by the judges it must be obtained through the stewards or the secretary.
8. Entries for all committee, who may decline to accept such entry without assigning any reason for doing so and entries for the exhibits in all classes are received by the judges, stewards, committee and that the decisions and awards may be given are final and not subject to any action of law.
9. Judges decision to be final.
10. The public must leave the building at 4.30pm after which time only the exhibitors will be admitted for removal of exhibits.
11. No stock or other exhibits to be sold by auction on the ground unless it has been shown for competition, and not until 4.30pm and by permission of the subcommittee.
12. The fee for a site at the show shall beset by the committee and subject to conditions in the Tradesite application.
13. No stand, tent or stall allowed on the ground unless applied for the fee set by the society to the secretary and paid in advance, no receipt will be recognized unless on the societies receipt and signed by the secretary or nominee of the society. The society reserves the right to refuse any person a stand or to cancel any stand or stall who cannot produce a receipt for the stand tent or stall by 11am will not be allowed to open and may be removed from the ground by the president secretary or any officer appointed by the society.
14. The president and the secretary or any appointed officer of the society shall have the power to enter any side show at any time they wish free of charge.
15. An area to be decided by the committee will be to exhibitors on which to display machinery, motors etc. which must not be removed until 4pm.
16. All entries close as per head on each section.
17. No steward shall influence a judge, but may assist in such capacity in any class.
18. Any exhibitor giving a wrong description of his or her exhibit with the intention of deceiving the society shall render such exhibit or exhibits liable to disqualification and the prize or prizes (if any) liable to forfeiture and may be debarred from exhibiting at any further show and exhibitors may be requested to make statutory declaration regarding their exhibits if the committee so desire.

19. Protests in all cases must be in writing and must be accompanied by a deposit of \$30.00 with the secretary, and may be forfeited if not upheld and must be lodged with the secretary, within ONE HOUR of judging.
20. The society will not under any circumstances hold itself liable for any accident on the grounds or premises.
21. The society will not under any circumstances hold itself responsible for any loss, damage to or mis-delivery of any exhibits or person property.
22. Exhibitors or their agents, if requested point out to stewards their respective exhibits in order that may be identified and numbered according to the catalogue, before being submitted to the judge.
23. Any prize awarded by the judge who may be withheld in consequence of valid protest, may be awarded to the exhibit next in order of merit.
24. Should any exhibit, having gained a prize, be disqualified the next in order of merit does not necessary obtain the prize. The committee with or without the advice of the judge shall decide the question.
25. Should a judge deem an entry unworthy of a prize the judge's opinion to be final. No exhibit necessarily awarded first prize.
26. Should there be any reason that any exhibit is either diseased or dangerous; the society reserves the right to refuse admittance to or remove the same from the ground at the expense of the exhibitor.
27. All persons exhibiting shall accept the decision of the judges appointed by the society as to the merits of their exhibits and in case of protests alleged infringements of the regulations the decision of the committee shall be accepted as final, except an appeal to the association.
28. No entry will be received from any person disqualified by this society or by the Northern Agricultural Show Association during the period of such disqualification, and should any entry be accidentally accepted it shall when discovered be deemed void and the entry fee be forfeited.
29. The committee reserves the right to refuse to accept any entry or having received same to refuse to allow the exhibit to compete without assigning any reason.
30. Any matter not dealt with shall be decided by the committee whose decision shall be final. Five to form a quorum.
31. Winners of cups and trophies will have their name engraved and the trophy will be held in trust by the society.
32. Any conditions or regulations printed in this prize list under the various sectional headings are to be construed as part of the regulations governing the conduct of the show of the society and equally binding on exhibitors
